UAE Civil Aviation Law and General Civil Aviation Authority Law

Empowers the GCAA to promulgate general policy for civil aviation and propose laws and regulations.





CAR M covers:

- "On the continuing airworthiness of aircraft and aeronautical products, parts and appliances, and on the approval of organisations and personnel involved in these tasks"
- Entry into force: 01st July 2011
- Full implementation: 01st July 2012
- Will be in parallel with CAR-OPS 1/3 Subpart M until 30th June 2012 and then replace Sub part M entirely from 01st July 2012.





Objective and Scope

Common technical requirements for ensuring the continuing airworthiness of aircraft:

- Registered in UAE
- Registered in a third country and used by a UAE operator where the GCAA assumes responsibility for the oversight of the continued airworthiness management functions of such an aircraft





Objective and Scope

- Common technical requirements for ensuring the continuing airworthiness of aircraft:
- Registered in UAE
- Registered in a third country and used by a UAE operator where the GCAA assumes responsibility for the oversight of the continued airworthiness management functions of such an aircraft
- Not applicable to aircraft where the regulatory oversight has been transferred to a third country and which are not used by a UAE Operator (ICAO Convention Article 83bis).

- "aircraft" means any machine that can derive support in the atmosphere from the reactions of the air other than reactions of the air against the earth's surface;
- "component" means any engine, propeller, part or appliance;
- "continuing airworthiness" means all of the processes ensuring that, at any time in its operating life, the aircraft complies with the airworthiness requirements in force and is in a condition for safe operation;
- "large aircraft" means an aircraft, classified as an aeroplane with a maximum take-off mass of more than 5700 kg, or a multi-engined helicopter;





- "maintenance" means any one or combination of overhaul, repair, inspection, replacement, modification or defect rectification of an aircraft or component, with the exception of pre-flight inspection;
- "organisation" means a natural person, a legal person or part of a legal person. Such an organisation may be established at more than one location;
- "pre-flight inspection" means the inspection carried out before flight to ensure that the aircraft is fit for the intended flight;
- "product" shall mean an aircraft, engine or propeller;





- "Commercial Air Transportation" means an aircraft operation involving the transport of passengers, cargo or mail for remuneration or hire. The term encompasses Air Transport Operators and Air Carriers;
- *** Definitions currently in CAR OPS 1/3.003 for Air Transport Operator, Air Carrier and Commercial Activities are still applicable.





Compliance Time Frame

Existing Commercial Air Transport (CAT)Operators

Should start applying for CAR M Subpart G Approval as soon as possible but must have an appropriate approval by the 30th June 2012 or could have their AOC revoked/suspended.

New CAT Operators

Must apply for CAR M Subpart G Approval as part of the application for an AOC/PAOC





Compliance Time Frame

Existing Non-CAT Operators

Can start applying for CAR M Sub part G approval or contract such an organization that has the appropriate GCAA approval.

Must have this by 30th June 2012

New Non-CAT Operators

Can apply for Sub part G approval or submit a contract with a GCAA Approved Subpart G Org.

What are the Changes – Highlights?

■ To Part IV - CAR OPS 1/3:

When CAR is in force on the 01st July 2012:

- 1. CAR OPS 1/3 Subpart M will be superseded by CAR M Subparts A,B,C,D,G and I
- 2. All references to Maintenance Management Exposition (MME) will be changed to Continuing Airworthiness Management Exposition (CAME)
- 3. All references to the paragraphs in Sub part M will change to reflect the paragraphs in CAR M

- 3. GCAA will not renew 'old style' C of As for those expiring after 30th June 2012
- 4. All C of As issued after 30th June 2012 must have a recommendation from a Subpart G Org or have a valid ARC (15a)
- 5. The first ARC will be issued by the GCAA Form 15a

Subpart A – General

M.101 Scope – states that:

This section establishes the measures to be taken to ensure that airworthiness is maintained, including maintenance.

It also specifies the conditions to be met by the persons or organisations involved in such continuing airworthiness management.





Subpart B – Accountability

- M. 201 Responsibilities
- M.202 Occurrence Reporting





Subpart B – Responsibilities – M.201

- a. The Owner/Lessee (or Operator) is responsible for the continuing airworthiness of an aircraft and shall ensure no flight takes place unless:
 - the aircraft is maintained in an airworthy condition and,
 - ii. operational and emergency equipment is serviceable or identified as unserviceable and,
 - iii. the Certificate of Airworthiness is valid and,
 - iv. maintenance is performed iaw an approved maintenance programme.





Subpart B – Responsibilities – M.201

- h. For Commercial Air Transport, the Operator is responsible for the continuing airworthiness of the aircraft it operates and shall:
 - i. Be approved iaw CAR M Subpart G (Continuing Airworthiness Management) for the aircraft it operates as part of its AOC.
 - Operator may <u>sub-contract</u> continuing airworthiness management tasks to another organisation working under the Operator's CAR M Subpart G approval. (Ref AMC M.201 (h)1)
 - ii. Be a CAR 145 approved organisation or contract such an organisation to perform the required maintenance.





Subpart B – Responsibilities – M.A.201

Notes:

- M201 (c) Any person or organisation performing maintenance shall be responsible for the tasks performed.
- M201(j) The owner / operator is responsible for granting the competent authority access to the organisation/aircraft to determine continued compliance with this CAR M.





Subpart B – Occurrence Reporting – M.202

Occurrence Reporting

- a. Any person or organisation responsible iaw M.201 shall report to the State of Registry, TC or STC holder and State of Operator any occurrence that could seriously hazard an aircraft.
 - M. 201 specifies Owners/Operators/ Approved Organisations,
 CAR 66 staff, pilots etc.
- Reports shall be made in a manner established by the GCAA i.e.
 ROSIs.

N/B: M202 (c) Person or Org. Maintaining the aircraft shall also report occurrences to owner/operator and the Continuing Airworthiness Management Org





CAR M Subparts – Applicability

Commercial Air Transport (CAT)



Commercial Air Transport Operators required to hold CAR M Subpart G approval to manage Subpart C Continuing Airworthiness tasks.

Operators may hold additional privilege to recommend / issue Airworthiness Review Certificates.

CAR M Subpart C – M.301

Continuing Airworthiness tasks:

- 1. Pre-Flight inspections
- Rectification of Defects.
- 3. Maintenance Programme tasks
- 4. Airworthiness Directives
- 5. Modifications and repairs (Changes)
- 6. Maintenance check flights.





CAR M Subpart C – M.302

Maintenance Programme:

- An existing approved CAR OPS 1/3.910 Subpart M Maintenance programme will normally satisfy Part M M.302 Maintenance programme requirements.
- An Operator will need to demonstrate that their Approved Maintenance Schedule satisfies CAR M.302 for an approved Maintenance programme.
 - The Maintenance Programme must be owned and managed by the AOC Operator under their CAR M Subpart G approval.





CAR M Subpart C – M.305

Aircraft record system

Shall contain the current:

- 1. Airworthiness Directive status
- 2. Modification and repair status
- 3. Maintenance programme compliance
- 4. Life limited component status
- 5. Mass and Balance report
- 6. List of deferred maintenance.





CAR M Subpart C – M.305

Aircraft record system

In addition should include:

Component authorised release document i.e GCAA AW Form 1. and

Component identification, P/Ns, S/Ns etc

Records controlled by the Operator or by the person responsible for continuing airworthiness tasks

All records must be clear and accurate, all corrections must show the original entry

Para (h) - Gives details of storage periods of Aircraft records






CAR M Subpart C – M.306

Operator's Technical Log System as required by CAR-OPS 1.185/1.1071

- a. Shall contain the following information:
 - Flight safety information.
 - ii. Current CRS.
 - iii. Current maintenance statement.
 - iv. Outstanding deferred defects.
 - v. Maintenance support arrangements.

 (+ Any necessary guidance instructions)







CAR M Subpart C – M.306

Operator's Technical Log System

Subsequent amendments shall be approved by the competent authority

c. Operator shall ensure the technical log is retained for 36 months

after the last entry

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CAR M Subpart C – M.307

Transfer of aircraft continuing airworthiness records:

Operator shall ensure all continuing airworthiness records are transferred when the aircraft is permanently transferred.

CAR M Subpart D – M.402

Performance of maintenance

- All Maintenance shall be performed by qualified personnel using current maintenance data.
 - i. Independent Inspections shall be carried out after any flight safety sensitive maintenance task unless otherwise specified by CAR 145 or agreed by the GCAA and i.a.w. CAR Part V, Chapter 2 Section 9
 - ii. In the UAE the GCAA will continue to require Duplicate Inspections to be performed in accordance with CAR Part V, Chapter 2, Section 9





CAR Subpart E – Components

- M 501 Installation (Standard parts and Material require evidence of conformity)
- M 502 Component Maintenance
- M 503 Service Life limited components
- M 504 Control of unserviceable components

CAR Subpart F – Maintenance Organization

- 1. Applicable to Orgs. for maintenance of aircraft and components not listed in M.201(g) which states maintenance of large aircraft, aircraft used for commercial air transport and components thereof shall be carried out by a CAR 145 Org.
- Approval issued for one year and i.a.w. requirements in this Sub part

CAR M Subpart G – M.701

Scope:

This subpart establishes the requirements to be met by an organisation to qualify for the issue or continuation of an approval for the management of aircraft continuing airworthiness.





CAR M Subpart G – M.702

Application:

 For Commercial Air Transport, an application for the issue of a CAR M Subpart G - Continuing Airworthiness Management approval shall be made to the GCAA as part of the AOC application.





CAR M Subpart G – M.702

Application:

- For Commercial Air Transport, an application for the issue of a CAR M Subpart G - Continuing Airworthiness Management approval shall be made to the GCAA as part of the AOC application.
- For a standalone (independent) Part M Subpart G approval (Non CAT), an application shall be made to Airworthiness Admin.
 Department, GCCA Dubai Office
- Application Forms see GCAA website





- Extent of approval
 - (a) Specified by the issue of an Approval Certificate and further defined in the scope of work in the Continuing Airworthiness Management Exposition (CAME).
 - (b) Part of the Air Operators Certificate for Commercial Air Transport Operators.

 - 1. Accountable Managers statement.
 - 2. Scope of Work.
 - 3. Nominated post holders.
 - 4. Organisation chart.
 - 5. Airworthiness review staff.
 - 6. Description and location of facilities.
 - 7. Organisational procedures.
 - 8. Amendment process.

Appendix V to AMC M.704 – gives a breakdown of CAME





CAR M Subpart G – M.705/706

M. 705 Facilities:

The continuing airworthiness management organisation shall provide suitable office accommodation at appropriate locations for the personnel specified in M.A.706.

M.706 – Personnel requirements:

- a) &b) Accountable Manager.
- c) Nominated persons (management).
- d) Nominated Post Holder for continuing airworthiness activities.
- f) Sufficient appropriately qualified staff.
- g) Must have relevant knowledge and experience





CAR M Subpart G – M.707

Airworthiness Review staff:

- Review staff will be identified in continuing airworthiness management exposition (CAME) together with their authorisation reference.
- Qualifications as per M 707 (a)
- Records will be maintained of all review staff





CAR M Subpart G – M.708

Continuing airworthiness management

- a. The management of Subpart C tasks
- b. For every aircraft the organisation shall:
 - 1. Develop a maintenance programme
 - 2. Manage the approval of changes.
 - 3. Ensure all maintenance is carried out.
 - 4. Ensure all airworthiness directives are complied with





- b. For every aircraft the organisation shall (contd..):
 - 6. Ensure reported defects are corrected
 - 7. Co-ordinate all scheduled maintenance
 - 8. Manage continuing airworthiness records
 - 9. Ensure the mass & balance is correct.
- Commercial Air Transport Operator's contract with a Part 145 maintenance organisation.





CAR M Subpart G – M.709

Documentation

The approved continuing airworthiness management organisation shall hold and use applicable current M.A.401 maintenance data in the performance of M.A.708 continuing airworthiness tasks.





CAR M Subpart G – M.710

- a. To satisfy Subpart I, a full documented review of the aircraft records shall be carried out by the approved continuing airworthiness management organisation
 - Aircraft records as listed in this para. (a) of M 710 (items 1 to 12)

- c. Aircraft survey shall include, Placards and Markings, Flight Manual, Configuration Approved, Defects Addressed i.a.w M. 403, no inconsistencies between aircraft and records.





CAR M Subpart G – M.710

Airworthiness Review:

d. The airworthiness review can be anticipated by a maximum period of 90 days to allow the physical review to take place during a maintenance check.





CAR M Subpart G – M.710

- d. The airworthiness review can be anticipated by a maximum period of 90 days to allow the physical review to take place during a maintenance check.
- e. An Airworthiness Review Certificate Form 15(b) shall be issued (for aircraft which have been in a controlled environment for more than 12 months), or, a recommendation to the Competent Authority (for the issue of an Form 15(a)) is made by appropriately authorised airworthiness review staff when satisfied that the review has been properly carried out.





CAR M Subpart G – M.710

 - The CAR M Subpart G applying for the additional airworthiness review privilege will need to demonstrate they have the in-house expertise and resources to carryout airworthiness reviews.
- h. Should the outcome of an airworthiness review be inconclusive, the CAR M Subpart G organisation shall inform the competent authority.

- b. For a Commercial Air Transport Operator, manage the continuing airworthiness of the commercial air transport aircraft listed on their Air Operators Certificate.
 - Sub-contract continuing airworthiness tasks to another organisation working under its quality system. (Ref. Appendix II).





- 2. A Subpart G approved organisation may additionally be approved to:
- a. Issue an Airworthiness Review Certificate
 - Issue Form 15(b) ARC for aircraft as listed on their approval certificate which are within a controlled environment, or;

Quality System

- a) Subpart G organisation must establish a quality system and designate a Quality Manager.
- b) Monitor all Subpart G activities
 - All CAW activities being performed in accordance with (iaw) approved procedures. (Including sub-contract tasks)
 - Monitoring contracted maintenance being carried out iaw the contract.





CAR M Subpart G – M.712

Quality System

- a) Subpart G organisation must establish a quality system and designate a Quality Manager.
- b) Monitor all Subpart G activities
 - All CAW activities being performed in accordance with (iaw) approved procedures. (Including sub-contract tasks)
 - Monitoring contracted maintenance being carried out iaw the contract.
 - AMC M. 712(b) Quality Independent Audit
 - All aspects of CAR M Subpart G compliance will be checked annually, including all the sub contract activities. Shall also include some product sampling.
 - May be completed as a single exercise or subdivided over the year in accordance with the organisations audit plan.





CAR M Subpart G – M.712

Quality System contd.

- c) Records of quality activities retained for two years.
- d) May be combined with another Part.
- e) For **Commercial Air Transport** (CAT) the quality system shall be an integral part of the Operators quality system.
- f) In the case of a small org. that is not managing CAT A/C, the quality system can be replaced by performing organisational reviews on a regular basis. (Reference CAR M AMC Appendix VIII.)





CAR M Subpart G – M.713

Continuing airworthiness organisation's shall notify the GCAA of any changes to:

- 1. Name of the organisation
- 2. Location of the organisation
- 3. Additional locations
- 4. Accountable manager
- 5. Any nominated persons
- 6. Facilities, procedures, work scope and staff affecting the approval





CAR M Subpart G – M.714

Record-keeping

CAMO shall:-

Record all details of work carried out

Retain a copy of each (ARC) and recommendation issued +supporting documents.

Retain (ARC) records 2 yrs after (pws)

Protect from damage alteration & theft

Keep computer backup at different locations

Transfer all records with the aircraft

Transfer all records to the owner when operations are terminated





CAR M Subpart G – M.715

Continued validity of approval :-

- 1. Issued for one year
- 2. Findings handled appropriately
- 3. Authority being given access

Certificate being returned to GCAA upon surrender or revocation.





CAR M Subpart H

- M 801 Aircraft Certificate of Release to Service (CRS)
 Only for aircraft that are not released i.a.w. CAR 145
- M 802 Component CRS
 Only for components that do not require a CAR 145 CRS
- M 803 Pilot-Owner Authorization

CAR M Subpart I – M.901

Airworthiness Review Certificate (ARC)

- An ARC (Form 15a or 15b) is issued upon completion of a satisfactory review and is valid for one year.
- Form 15a will be issued by the GCAA.
 GCAA will issue for 'New' aircraft and, following a recommendation from a CAR M Subpart G, issue / renew for 'Used' aircraft.
- Form 15b will be issued by Approved Org. but needs to be endorsed by the GCAA
- The ARC or endorsed ARC is considered part of the Certificate of Airworthiness





Subpart I − M. 902

Validity of Airworthiness Review Certificate

- a) An Airworthiness Review Certificate becomes invalid if:
 - a. Suspended or revoked; or
 - b. The Certificate of Airworthiness (C of A) is suspended or revoked.
 - c. The aircraft is no longer on the register of the UAE.
 - d. The applicable type certificate is suspended or revoked.





Validity of ARC – Subpart I-M. 902

- a) An Airworthiness Review Certificate becomes invalid if:
 - a) Suspended or revoked; or
 - b) The Certificate of Airworthiness (C of A) is suspended or revoked.
 - c) The aircraft is no longer on the register of the UAE.
 - d) The applicable type certificate is suspended or revoked.
- b) An aircraft must not fly if the C of A is invalid or:
 - a) The continuing airworthiness or any component does not meet Part M requirements, or;
 - b) The aircraft does not remain in conformity with the type design.
 - c) The aircraft has been operated beyond the limitations of the Flight Manual without appropriate action being taken.
 - d) The aircraft has been involved in an accident without subsequent action being taken to restore airworthiness.
 - e) A modification or repair has not been approved law CAR 21.
