SUBJECT : CHANGE INVOLVING PILOTS OVER 60 YEARS OF AGE

Please be advised that the GCAA will adopt the ICAO Amendment No. 167 for over 60 years pilots as follows, during the next CAR amendment. Hence, you are requested to comply with this Information Bulletin.

Pilot over 60 years: the following curtailment of privileges of pilot licence holders aged 60 years or more apply with immediate effect;

- (a) Age 60 – 64. The holder of a pilot licence who has attained the age of 60 years shall not act as a pilot of an aircraft engaged in commercial air transport operations except;
- (i) as a member of a multi-pilot crew and provided that,
- (ii) such holder is the only pilot in the flight crew who has attained age 60.
- (b) Age 65. The holder of a pilot licence who has attained the age of 65 years shall not act as a pilot of an aircraft engaged in commercial air transport operations.

- (c) Unless otherwise specified by the Authority, the holder of a pilot licence who has attained the age of 65 years shall not act as a pilot of an aircraft engaged in private operations.
